## VP of Music & Performance Qualifications & Responsibilities

# **Program VP / Coordinator**

- Puts the MT plan into action on weekly basis
- Establishes weekly Chapter Meeting Schedule
- Coordinates with CD, VP M&P and chapter officers for their requirements and support
- MCs chapter meeting
- Needs excellent planning skills and likeable personality

# **Chorus Director Duties**

- Develop yearly music plan
- With VP of Mu&P selects music team
- Oversee MT members who deal with chorus musically
- Conduct weekly chorus rehearsal
- Direct all public performances
- Aid in repertoire selection
- Attend all MT meetings and planning sessions
- Supervise and/or conduct craft sessions
- Assist in developing standards for performing chorus
- Supervise voice placements
- Encourage Quarteting
- Attend Director Schools

# Selecting a Director

- Form Director Selection/Search Committee
  - Board, MT, Members at large
  - Review goals, history, set criteria, plan & schedule
- Who's out there who can help you find out?
- Make list of candidates; both solicited and not
- Parse the list to A&B call the A list
- Determine interest and adherence to criteria
- Set up audition schedule
- Conduct auditions & interview chorus votes
- Select / notify new CD informal agreement
- Notify other candidates
- Complete music director contract

## The Chorus Director Rocky Impossible vs Joe Barbershopper

- Dictatorial
  - My way or highway
  - Does it all
- Big ego big salary
- Making a name (just passing through)
- Three hour chorus rehearsal
- Selects music too hard for chorus
- It's everyone else's fault!

- Empathetic
- Compassionate
- Excellent leader
- Great musical sense
- Awesome hands
- Perfect pitch
- Realistic expectations
- Something for everyone

## Chorus Director & Music Team Working Together!

- The Chorus Director is The Man
- CD must trust and have rapport with team
- Team must support the CD be prepared!
- Music Team develops music program based on Chapter Mission Statement - should be planned, annual program, constant review
- Selects repertoire based on chorus capabilities
- Presentation plan supports repertoire
- Major thrust of cooperation is toward weekly meeting
- Communication is key

## Chorus Director and VP Mu&P Their Relationship

- VP of Mu&P is an elected, voting member of the chapter board - he is the athletic director - the music program administrator - direct link between board and music team
- CD is hired or appointed by Board he is the head coach - accountable for music teaching and performance of the chorus
- These two are primarily responsible for the total chapter music program

## Chorus Director and VP Mu&P Working Together!

- Mutual respect is important
- Understand each others responsibilities
- Allow each other to exercise responsibilities
- Maintain constant communication concerning the chapter music program
- Focus on today, but work toward tomorrow's goals

## Let Each Other Do His Job - VP Mu&P

- VP of Music and Performance is an administrator and an organizer. Provides administrative and logistical support to music team that allows music team to run the music program - carries music team message to board and sells it!
- He may have some musical acumen, but that's not his forte - he should not try to run the chapter music program - nor should he allow the board to do likewise!

### Let Each Other Do His Job - Director

- The Chorus Director is responsible for all aspects of the chapter music program
- Develops music program based on long range chapter goals - selects section leaders
- Develops weekly music plan for chapter meeting and is responsible for it's conduct
- Avoids chapter politics attends board meetings if requested or when he feels it is vital to his functioning within the Chapter

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# **Yearly Planning Meeting**

- Hold before Board Planning Mtg late Fall weekend
- MuVP and CD plan agenda
- Establish / Review / Renew long term goals
- Review year's musical program/progress
  - Accomplishments? Attained goals? Objectives?
  - What worked well? Not so well?
  - Music selection OK? Review repertoire
  - Evaluate Performance Standards
  - Review Music Team composition and members
- Establish / Confirm yearly goals and measures
- Plan the musical calendar
- Develop proposed yearly music budget

# **Planning the Musical Calendar**

- Schedule the year: shows, retreats, schools, competitions, Singing Valentines
- Plan Recruitment, Orientation, and Retention
- Plan Coaching
- Plan Community Education and Outreach
- Plan Youth and Senior Outreach
- Plan Quartet Activity
- Plan Chapter Meetings

# **Budget Development**

- Director fees or expenses
- Music
- Schools and training
- Learning tracks, books and supplies
- Coaching fees and expenses
  - District Coach reimbursement program
- Retreats
- Uniforms
- Conventions

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# **The Chapter Meeting**

- Plan a variety of activities for each meeting
  - Vocal warm-up care of instrument
  - Chorus Rehearsal follow the leaders
  - Craft learn
  - Business Meeting announcements
  - Break relax
  - Fun singing (Barberpole Cat, Harmony Classics, etc.)
  - Quartet Activity build confidence
  - Woodshedding / Tags train the ear

- 8:05 Warm-up
- 8:15 Chorus rehearsal new music
- 9:00 Fun sing, tags, woodshed
- 9:10 Break
- 9:20 Business meeting (do you have a weekly bulletin?)
- 9:30 Chorus rehearsal current repertoire
- 10:10 Fun program; quarteting, other activity
- 10:25 Closing; Keep The Whole World Singing
- 10:30 Coffee, woodshedding, tags, fellowship, afterglow

# **The Chapter Meeting**

- Other Activities (organized by PVP)
  - Learn more about the judging categories
  - Watch Society video tapes
  - Alumni night
  - Quartet appreciation night
  - Take a mystery bus trip (chapter exchange)
  - Honor past presidents
  - Hold a "strictly-NOT-barbershop" night
  - Organize a community/holiday chorus
  - Lights out and listen
  - Sponsor appreciation night

### The Music Leadership Team During Chapter Meetings

- Voice placement and auditions Auditions Team
- Warm-up good vocal teacher
- Fun singing & woodshedding tagmeister
- Quarteting
- Every activity should involve craft
- Sectional rehearsals section leaders
- Chorus rehearsal repertoire & new music under direction of CD (or Ass't)

# **Teaching Methods**

- Director brute force
- Piano accompaniment
- Learning tracks/CDs
- Sectionals
- Taping for assessment/training
- Weekly taping with personal recorder
- Quartet teaching
- Section Leaders
- Written lesson plan for team

## **MLT Post-Chapter Meeting Review**

- Chaired by the VP Mu&P
- Review meeting results objectives met?
- Review / Revise next week's plan from Master Plan
- Review audition results
- Other musical issues
- Refine actions during week

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## Why Have a Quartet Program?

- Membership Enjoyment
  - Organized quartets (Registered or otherwise)
  - Informal quarteting, tagging
  - VLQs
- Vocal Improvement (individual and chorus)
- Chapter Growth
- Chapter Financial Health
  - Quartet Performances
  - Singing Valentines
  - Quartets on Chapter Shows
- Public Awareness

- Select a Quartet Development Chairman (QDC)
- Voice place each member
  - Done as part of chorus qualifications
  - Who sings falsetto?
  - Who sings multiple parts?
- Have members learn different parts
  - More flexibility when quartets are forming
- Develop list of potential quartet members
  - Help form quartets
  - Ensure quartets get a chance to sing each week
  - Lack of interest should not deter QDC from putting together quartets JUST FOR FUN!

- Small group workouts
  - The more a man sings in smaller groups, the better singer he becomes
  - Increases each man's confidence
- VLQ Program
  - Experienced singers with inexperienced
  - Chorus repertoire and special fun music

- Barberpole Cat & Harmony Classics
  - Quarteting is universal across the Society
  - Special sessions help teach the songs
  - Many different ways to do and recognize the members
- Quarteting during meetings
  - One quartet and/or VLQ every week
  - New quartet sings a Barberpole Cat or Harmony Classic
  - Experienced quartet sings repertoire or contest song

- Qualifying for Show or Contest
  - Members sing chorus music in Quartet or VLQ
  - Assurance to singer and MLT that singer knows music
  - A confidence builder
- Quartet Coaching
  - Chapter coaches
  - Local coaches
  - Chapter quartet coaching weekend
  - District Music Education Programs

## **Feature Your Quartets**

- Yearly novice contest
- Tag singing contests
- Parade of quartets
- Singing Valentines
- Christmas Caroling
- Birthdays, parties, etc.
- Chapter Shows
- Competition

### **Quartets and the Chorus**

#### Section Leaders

- Can make learning tracks
- Teach music

#### The quartet learning method

- Let one of your chapter quartets teach a song
- Coach them ahead of time so chorus learns correctly
- Keeps quartets involved
- Gives them a sense of leadership
- Training/evaluation by quarteting
  - Predefine expectations of singers
  - Everyone sings as part of a quartet

#### **Quartets and the Chorus**

- Additional Benefits of Quartets in the Chorus
  - Carrying the Chapter flag
  - Membership in the chapter
  - Paying your quartets
  - Mutual support

# **Singing Valentines**

- Quartet Training start early
  - Teach in Chorus setting
  - Create quartets; mix and match from Chapter
  - Look and sound good
  - Sing in front of Chapter or Music Team
- The Presentation
  - A good impression whether school or business we should deliver our message and move along
  - One song is enough!
  - Stay focused and sing from the heart
  - Be prepared for tears, visitors, and surprises

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#### Recruitment

- Relates to Chapter Goals
- How big should a chapter be?
- Who should we pursue? or, Be careful what you ask for because you just might get it!
  - "Is he breathing?"
  - Trainable & trained singers
- Guest nights
- Prospective member expectations
- Chapter expectations
- Finances
- Voice Placement / Auditions

## **Elements of Orientation & Retention**

- Mentor (Buddy) program
- Routing form
- Riser placement
- Society & Chapter history
- Music & choreography education
- Celebration of first performance!!!
- Tracking attendance
- Lifeblood check are we giving them what they want?

#### Music Team Working With the Membership Team

- Establishing guest nights
- Voice placing visitors and guests auditioning prospective members
- Monitor progress of guests and new members
- Learning chorus repertoire as part of chapter indoctrination process
- Monitor musical progress of new members as function of retention

#### Music Team Working With the Membership Team

- Rookie School
  - All the new guys for defined period
  - Learn chorus repertoire, Barberpole Cats, Harmony Classics
  - Get vocal training
  - Develop performance skills
  - Learn about the history of the Society
  - Intro to quarteting

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## **Chorus Membership Requirements**

- Tied to Mission Statement
- Attendance requirements
- Performance standards:
  - Established for "Performing Chorus"?
  - Visual & vocal standards
  - What constitutes "performance ready"?
  - Other?
- What's the Music Team's responsibility in improving the chorus' capability to sing better?

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#### **Chorus Performance** Standards and Requirements

- Adequate notification to chapter
- How often to perform?
- Venue requirements; stage, house, foyer, dressing, restrooms, disabled, load-in, sound, lights, safety, etc
- Type audience
- Length of performance
- Use chorus manager for logistics planning
- Chorus requirements?
- Compensation?

- Basic Activity Level
  - Basic singing skills
  - "Fun" singing Barberpole Cats & Harmony Classics
  - Develop a repertoire
  - Create a package
  - "Just us" shows
  - Harmony for Lunch
  - Performance fundamentals

- Intermediate Level
  - Craft Sessions
  - Sectionals
  - Outside coaching
  - Performance standards
  - Annual Show
  - Contest
- Advanced Level
  - Theatrical performances
  - High profile venues
  - Symphonies & arts
  - Musical Excellence

## **Types of Performances**

- Chapter Performances
  - Annual Shows
  - Chapter Shows; SPEBSQSA, SAI, HI
  - Christmas Cabaret
  - Installation Banquet
- Chapter visitations
- Civic/Community:
  - National Anthem & Patriotic songs
  - Parades (don't sing, use tapes & wave a lot)
  - Street or County fairs; chorus, strolling quartets, booth
  - Community & Summer Concert series
  - Police/Fire department annual memorial services
  - Holiday Chorus

### **Types of Performances**

- Senior Citizen Communities
  - community centers, trailer parks, Leisure World
- Military Shows
  - Local base open house, WWII reunions, Memorial Day, Reserve or Guard functions, associations
- Malls
- Schools and Churches
  - YMIH, Keep America Singing
  - Church socials, choir substitute, combined chorus/choir
- Hospitals
  - At Christmas
  - Children's & Retirement/Convalescent Homes

### **Types of Performances**

- Fundraisers
  - Community, schools, churches
  - Public Television "Keep America Singing"
- Conventions
- Corporate/Stockholder Meetings
- Service Organizations
- Singing Valentines
- Mothers Day
- Other:
  - Museums, societies, music festivals, bowl shows, farmers market, reunions

## **Selecting Repertoire**

- Review regularly and at Yearly Planning Session
- Show and Competition
- Opener, easy beat, ballad, novelty (patriotic, spiritual, comedy, solo), closer
- Theme Packages & visual possibilities
- Music suitable to the performer (degree of difficulty)
