- This year's inductee joined the Society in 1976

- He twice directed one of those chapters to an International top 10 finish. Both were the same chapter.

- Served on the Society's Music and Performance Committee
- Directed one chapter three different times
- He sang in two FWD Champion quartets, both International Top 20
- He sang in one Medalist Senior quartet
- He sang two different parts in one quartet
- He has served on the Harmony College Faculty
- Director or Assistant Director of five different FWD chapters and one chapter in another district.
- Served on the World Harmony Council
- Served as FWD C&J Chairman
- Before he was a Music Judge, he was certified in the old Sound category, then in the current Singing category.
- Category Board of Review in Sound, then Singing. Then Category Specialist in Singing.
- Served as FWD C&I Chairman a second time
- Once International C&J Chairman
- Served on the Society's Chorus Director Development Committee
- Current FWD Director of C&I
- Those five chapters were: Whittier, Fresno, Bay Area Metro, Phoenix, San Diego, and Central Texas Corridor
- Those quartets were Rhythm and Rhyme and Great Western Timbre Co.
