#### **District Board Members and Past District Presidents:**


No Credential Card is required for your participation in the HOD. Please be seated at your respective locations as follows:

President Young introduced Society Board Member John Miller.

John addressed the House of Delegates and brought greetings from Society President Alan Lamson and the Society Board. Among other things, his comments included the following:

New CEO Marty Monson started work in August and is off to a running start. John commented that the search for a new CEO took longer than anticipated but that the Society Board is very pleased with Marty's selection and wish him every success.

John called everyone's attention to the report from Marty included in the Fall Brochure and to the letter regarding the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Society to be celebrated in Toronto in July 2013. The actual anniversary is on April 11, 2013. The Society is encouraging Districts to request governors, mayors, etc. to declare our anniversary a special day.

John then commented on Operation Harold Hill. He discussed the need to engage younger members while retaining the older members. He reviewed actual research from NBC: 28% didn't like Barbershop Harmony and 28% didn't know what it was. The research did reveal, however, that while the overall percentage of men in the overall population who are interested in barbershop harmony is small the number of men in that cohort is quite large. It's a big country. His remarks were very encouraging.

President Young summarized the actions taken by the Board of Directors at the Fall meeting held the previous day.

Among other items, Russ commented on the following items:

Leadership Academy to be held in Pico Rivera, CA in November and in Mesa, AZ in January.

The merger of the Las Vegas and Las Vegas Metro Chapters has been approved effective Jan. 1, 2013

President Young recognized Brea and Santa Rosa Chapters for achievements in membership growth

Russ commented on Harmony College West and encouraged greater attendance at future Colleges.

Russ then turned the meeting over to Allen Webb, EVP, who reported on overall membership trends in the district.

At the completion of Allen's report Russ commented on the ongoing District planning process which will result in some long and short term goals and work plans.

He reminded the House that coaching is available from the AFWDC.

A new Far Western District website will go online shortly. We now have two co-webmasters: Keith Eckhardt and David Melville. Russ announced some other changes to the District Management Team: The new chairman of Chorus Director Development is Dr. Greg Lyne and the new Marketing and PR chairman is Jerry McElfrish Russ also announced that the new District Historian in John Minsker.

<u>Artistic License</u> was then introduced. They beautifully accompanied the reading of the names of our departed brother during the past year.

Granting of show clearance will be done only by the District Secretary, and the following rules will apply:

a) No show clearances are to be granted on District convention weekends, or Divisional Leadership Academy (see Art. XII para 12.3)Harmony Jubilee, Harmony College West or Chorus Director Seminar weekends.

b) A clearance may not be issued to a chapter within 50 miles of a chapter that has a previously cleared date.

c) Paragraph (b) may be waived with the consent of the chapter(s) that has received clearance.

d) Show clearance will not be granted on the same date as a chapter's own division quartet or chorus contest

#### Proposed change: Delete b) and c), and re-designate d) as b).

#### Motion to approve. Motion carried.

#### 8.3.2.1.2. HIGH SCHOOL CONTESTS

The FWD High School Quartet Contest shall be held during the Spring International Preliminary Quartet Contest weekend. The members of the High School quartet shall each be a currently enrolled junior high or high school student from any combination of high schools located within the boundaries of the Far Western District.

Each competing high school quartet member plus one coach or chaperone for each quartet shall receive an all events registration for the Spring Prelims at no charge, to encourage their exposure to a high level of barbershop quartet singing. Furthermore, admission to the high school quartet contest session shall be free and open to the general public, with open (non-assigned) seating.

ADD:

The High School Quartet Contest shall be administered under the auspices of the District Representative for Contest and Judging working with the District Chairman for Youth in Harmony. For this contest the procedures governing the operation, scoring, CA duties, evaluation and publication and announcement of results shall be identified in the District Spring Convention Regulations.

#### Motion to enter executive session. Motion carried.

The meeting went into executive session to discuss issues regarding the new FWD website and issues regarding the AFWDC. The meeting emerged from executive session at approximately 3:35 pm.

#### Motion to end executive session. Motion carried.

Motion to approve agenda. Motion carried.

#### Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting in Fullerton. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the meeting agenda. Motion carried.

#### President Young introduced Society board member John Miller.

John provided the board with an update of recent events at headquarters in Nashville. The Society has a new Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer, Marty Monson. Marty assumed his position in mid-August after attending Harmony University. John also reported on the membership numbers for the Society and expressed the hope that Operation Harold Hill can help spur growth. Retention of new members remains an issue. John shared with the board some research that was conducted regarding the visibility of the Society. While many people have no real knowledge of our Society there remains a significant number of men who do know of us and would be interested in singing with us.

Preparations continue for the Society's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary to be celebrated in Toronto in July 2013. The actual anniversary is April 11, 2013. Governors and mayors are being asked to acknowledge this special day with a proclamation. The Far Western District is comprised of the states of Arizona, Nevada, California, Hawaii and part of Utah.

Finally, John reported that the Portland convention had 5,700 attendees and was profitable.

Welcome to the Far Western District Spring Convention. As usual, the convention team and District Event Team has been working diligently to see that we have an eventful weekend.

The end of 2012 and beginning of 2013 has been a busy one for the District. With the appointment of some new DMT members and the District leadership working to accomplish set goals for this year, activities and opportunities are reaching new heights.

#### **Educational Events**

Two Leadership Academies have been held in Southern CA and Mesa AZ respectively since the last HOD meeting. Both schools received outstanding feedback from attendees. On average, about 30% of the potential Southern California chapter officers and 69% of those in Arizona attended their respective academy. While it would be optimal to have 100% attendance, I was encouraged at the high level of participation from those who were able to attend.

The Learn To Sing program continues to offer clinicians to chapters wishing to help potential members with singing instruction. Alan Gordon has developed a wonderful curriculum that has proved to be beneficial to participants in the past. There is no cost to chapters if they wish to take advantage of this fine program to enhance their membership growth plan.

A recent weekend in Pleasanton, CA proved to be a huge success for musical directors, assistant and aspiring directors. CDWI (Chorus Director Workshop Intensive), OiF (Outstanding in Front), and Intermediate Chorus Directing sessions were offered to an appreciative student body. They took advantage of both Society-trained faculty members as well as our own local talent to improve their own directing techniques. Special thanks go to Dr. Greg Lyne (FWD Chorus Director Development Chair) for his planning and to Keith Echkardt for handling the logistics to make this weekend possible.

Harmony College West plans are underway. The best-ever faculty is being secured at this time, to include four gold medal chorus directors to share their talents with students. The school will be open to FWD members (discounted price), Associates, members of neighboring districts and Sweet Adeline members. I'm convinced that this will go down as the best HCW to date. I encourage every chapter to send their music team to Hayward on August 16-18.

#### 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

The Society celebrates its 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this year. Requests have gone to the Governors' offices of states within our District to declare the week of April 7-13 as Barbershop Harmony Week. Many chapters are using all or part of the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration as a theme for their shows this year.

The FWD has joined other Districts and purchased a full-page ad in the Anniversary Edition of the Harmonizer as a show of support for the event.

#### Youth Festival Sponsorship

I'm happy to announce that the FWD reached its goal of donating \$10k to the Harmony Foundation in December. We had XX chapters and 2 quartets contribute on behalf of the District and received recognition at the Mid-Winter Convention in Orlando, FL. I have high hopes that the FWD will once again be a sponsor as the Mid-Winter comes to Long Beach next January.


#### **Society Board Considerations**

- 1. Dues collections were on budget but we have budgeted \$50,000 for 2013 and that number should probably be revised.
- 2. Our income from the Spring and Fall Conventions was disappointing.
- 3. The "Other" income item of 284.59 is the reimbursement we received from the BHS for the expenses incurred for the Chapter Visitations in 2011.
- 4. The Webcast income was \$1623 less expenses of \$975 for a net of \$648
- 5. Major donations received:

Note: In the past a lot of donations and fees were not tracked. The budget was prepared in June of 2011, before we had experience with recording all donations and fees, and that resulted in the discrepancies with the budget. During 2011 and 2012 donations to the Youth Education Fund have been substantially less than the amount paid out from that fund..

- 7. The Board meeting expenses exceeded budget. This is probably because of increases in hotel and airline fares. The Board should consider increasing the budget for 2013.
- 8. The YMIH expenses included \$16,340.04 for the Northern California Youth Camp, \$1,200 to support the Music Programs of the schools sponsoring High School Quartets, and one \$500 grant for a chapter that sponsored a Youth Festival.
- 9. The major Music & Performance expenses were \$16,129.51 for Harmony College West. With only \$10,705 in registration fees, our net cost for HCW was \$5,379.51 and the budget was \$3000.
- 10. The Marketing & PR expenses were under budget because we only printed and mailed three issues of Westunes.
- 11. The Chapter Support expenses include \$2890.02 for Leadership Academy and with the Registrations Fees of \$3600, we had a surplus of \$709.98 for the event.

Balance Sheet

- 1. The prepaid deposits include venue deposits for the Spring and Fall Conventions in 2013.
- 2. The accounts payable are for the BHS Leadership Forum and the rental of the school for the Leadership Academy. Final bills have not been received.

Harmony Platoons in Full Swing

The new quartet activity called Harmony Platoons (invented in FWD in 2012) is in full swing at all three 2013 FWD Division spring conventions, including the Prelims in Lodi this month, AZ Division in April and SE/SW Divisions in May.

Each of the District-wide Platoons in 2012 drew 60+ men from around 30 different chapters. Besides enjoyment for the singers, the Platoon provided entertainment for those attending the convention, as their final contest/show was open to all.

In addition to quartet experience at the convention, many of the Platooners have formed quartets when they got "back home", either with contacts they made through Platoon or using the newly learned Platoon songs, or both. A good example would be the 2013 Southern California Novice Quartet Contest, where the prior spring's Platoon winner finished #3 at Novice and whose tenor sang in another quartet that won Novice. At least 8 men from Platoons sang in that contest. More than one Division contest last year included a newly formed quartet of Platoon guys with newly learned Platoon songs. At least one of these qualified and sang at District.

Each Platoon includes both returning singers, happy with the experience they've had before, as well as many new men trying it for the first time. . .many trying quartetting for the first time. Harmony Platoon is proving to be a useful new tool in quartet development for the District.
