<u>President Webb</u> introduced the Barbershop Harmony Society Board Member, Mr. Dick Powell. Mr. Powell addressed the Board and Delegates in attendance about where the Society is headed.

<u>President Webb</u> entertained a motion to approve the Agenda with the correct date. Moved & Second **Motion Approved.** 

<u>President Webb</u> entertained a motion to approve the minutes from the Spring HOD Meeting. Moved and Second **Motion Approved.** 

<u>President Webb</u> entertained a motion to accept the receipt of the HOD Reports. Moved & Second **Motion Approved.** 

**President Webb** discussed the Chapter Coaching Program as outlined in the HOD Brochure.

He also discussed Convention Funding changes, registration price restructuring, and he presented information on proposed changes to the SOP regarding the District Youth Education Fund. The Fund will no longer be only Youth in Harmony, but will become available to all Chapters for Grants.

New Wording 13.2 "13.2 DISTRICT OUTREACH ENDOWMENT FUND The Far Western District Outreach Endowment Fund is established for the purpose of supporting outreach and educational activities in the Far Western District.

The Fund is derived from voluntary contributions by members, chapters and friends of the district, as well as by initial seed money from the Far Western District treasury. The Fund is maintained by Harmony Foundation on behalf of the Far Western District, with proceeds from the Fund's income used to fund outreach and educational activities.

Monies from the Fund are to be spent on projects as recommended by the District Board. These projects may include, but are not limited to: youth camps, scholarships, seminars for music educators, audio-visual materials, manuals and educational materials, augmentation of district outreach budget items such as high school quartet scholarship awards and Collegiate Barbershop Quartet travel, new chapter startup activities, adult outreach programs to potential members by existing chapters, and other projects as may be appropriate.

Where these projects are offered to minors, such as youths attending FWD youth camps, an appropriate release form will be provided to and executed by the parent or guardian providing for appropriate release for medical and/or accident circumstances and will also contain a "hold harmless" clause against the sponsors, FWD and SPEBSQSA, Inc.

Applications for project funding for outreach activities should be made through the appropriate committee chairmen: YIH Chair for youth activities, Membership Chair for new chapter startups, CDD Chair for Chorus Director Development, etc. For any requests which don't appear to fit under an existing committee chair, contact the Executive Vice President.

The annual budget of the Far Western District may include projected grant distributions from the fund, provided that such distributions do not exceed the expected income (donations/interest/capital gains), or 5% of the Fund, whichever is the lesser amount. To the extent that those numbers change during the budget year, expanded mid or late year grants may be accommodated if the financial state of the Fund allows for it.

The intention behind this funding/spending model is to allow for the Outreach Endowment Fund to always be in a state of growth, and eventually be large enough to fund substantial outreach programs entirely from the interest/capital gains of the Fund's investments."

For the purposes of establishing the initial balance of the fund, the phrase "initial seed money

from the Far Western District treasury" above is defined as the amount necessary to bring the balance of the fund to \$30k as of Jan. 1, 2015, after rolling over the current Youth Outreach Fund balance (~\$4k) and adding in the 2014 donation total (estimated ~\$6k), which would require an estimated ~\$20k from our bank account to accomplish. The first year (2015) we would therefore begin with a total grant limit of 5% (\$1500, approximately what our District grant activity was in 2014), but could adjust upwards during the course of the year if the financial state of the fund grows enough. Given that we usually show about \$6k worth of donation income per year (which we hope to increase), the fund should grow relatively quickly over the next several years and allow us to budget for increasing amounts of grants for various outreach activities.

Based on the recommendation of the Far Western District Board to the Far Western District House of Delegates, the motion to change the wording of the SOP to allow the establishment of the "Outreach Endowment Fund" was presented: **Motion Approved.** 

Treasurer Max Bates and President Allan Webb presented the 2015 Budget for Approval.

Motion and Second to approve the budget as presented. Motion Approved

General discussion and points of Interest which were covered:

- Chapters delinquent with required filings in the District.
- Consolidating the Convention Manuals from three to one. Jim Turnmire will work on the consolidation.
- Harmony College West and Leadership Academy on Jan. 23 to 25 2014 in Las Vegas.

**Ted Sayle, Events Chairman,** introduced incoming Chairman Bryan Forbes. They presented for approval the locations for future Conventions.

Larry Womac from California Delta agreed to host the **Spring NW/NE convention and Prelims** on March 19 to 21, 2015 in Sacramento. Motion and Second. **Motion Approved.** 

**Arizona Division** hosted by Tucson at Skyline High School in Mesa April 25, 2015. Motion and Second. **Motion Approved.** 

**Fall 2015 District Contest** October 16 to 18, 2015 hosted by Phoenix was approved last year. **SW/SE Division** hosted by Santa Fe Springs May 9, 2015 in Santa Monica. Motion & Second.

**President Allan Webb** thanked Ted Sayle for putting his retirement on hold and for chairing the Events Committee for the past two years.

**President Allan Webb** opened the meeting for a prepared comment from the floor by Rich Jensen from the South Orange County Chapter:

"Thank you for the opportunity to address this House of Delegates and the Far Western Districts Board of Directors.

I am the delegate from South County Sound, a product of a successful merging of two dying chapters in South Orange County, California.

We have been fortunate to grow slightly over our 3 years with some advertising and member referrals, but certainly meager to our true potential.

Overall however, the Districts membership continues to free fall.

We believe this decline is caused by the lack of knowledge of our hobby and what we do, from the general public.

We've noticed that the 2015 FWD budget for Membership is \$800. The budget for Marketing in 2015 was cut by \$1500 to \$5,500. The FWD overall budget is proposed to increase by 58% in 2015, yet none of that money is earmarked toward increasing membership, as we see it; Yet all 5 of these DVP reports include continued dismay of our declining membership numbers.

We're asking the Board to do something District wide in helping it's 75 chapters (1) Expose and Quell the myths and misconceptions of Barbershop Harmony and (2) build up our brand to the general public.

Most everyone can sing. We know it's healthy to sing. We know it's fun to sing with others. We also know that a huge percentage of the many, many millions in and around us, have no idea where or how to find this joy.

**Motion Approved.** 

Each Chapter is a small island and can't do much by themselves, but with the power of the District, we can all succeed and start to see the upturn and excitement of more new singers finding us.

AS one idea; With a healthy budget for Membership and Marketing, a professional marketer could step outside of our box and get to work fixing, by lifting our brand and inviting others to join us throughout our 4 states of influence.

We trust our other chapters will support this plea.

Thank you very much for your time."

President Allan Webb, and Immediate Past President Russ Young presented a rebuttal discussing recruiting and member retention.

The next House of Delegates Meeting will be March 20, 2015 in Sacramento California.

President Allan Webb led the delegates in "Keep the Whole World Singing."

President Allan Webb entertained a motion to adjourn. Moved and Second. Motion Approved.

### **Minutes of the Fall BOD Meeting**



Far Western District Board of Directors October 8, 2014 Fresno, California

Meeting was called to order by President Allan Webb at 2:05 PM

Immediate Past President Russ Young directed "The Old Songs".

**Div. 4 VP Richard Lund** gave the Invocation.

<u>President Allan Webb</u> welcomed all board members and guests. He acknowledged Dick Powell from the Society Board, and Jim Clark from Harmony Foundation, adding Jim Clark to the Agenda.

President Webb then introduced Dick Powell who was sitting in for Don Fuson the Society President who had a conflicting date. Mr. Powell discussed changes which have taken place, and plans for the future. He pointed out that there is now a Professional Leadership team in place. Mr. Powell advised that there is a lot going on, with lots of great things happening.

<u>President Allan Webb</u> in his report to the Board of Directors discussed the "Forum" email system. He expressed that desire that board members use the system for more BOD communications between regular meetings. President Webb also talked about Society level priorities and the Outreach fund information. Mr. Webb also requested that under "New Business" on the agenda the item to modify next year's budget be added.

Roll Call was taken by Secretary Bob Gray who reported to President Webb that all members were in attendance, and that a quorum was present. Board members present: Allan Webb, Russ Young, Gordon Bergthold, Bob Gray, Max Bates, Bob Lally, Craig Hughes, Chuck Leavitt, Richard Lund, and John Bloomquist.

**President Webb** entertained a motion to approve the meeting agenda, with the additional items added.

1. Jim Clark Harmony Foundation: 2. Modify next year's budget based on Nashville Leadership Forum for 2015: 3. 2016 Contest date may conflict with the Sweet Adelines International Convention. Motion to approve the revised agenda. Moved & Seconded. **Motion Approved.** 

President Webb entertained a motion to approve the minutes from the June 7, 2014 District Board meeting in Fullerton. Motion by Craig Hughes, Second by Richard Lund. **Motion Carried**.

The Division Vice President Reports were published in the Fall HOD Brochure. There were additional reports by the Division Vice Presidents.

<u>Division 1 Southwest VP Bob Lally</u> reported that Bakersfield is trying to revitalize and become more active. He also reported on the success story of Rincon Beach. They started the year as a 20 man chapter, and they have gained seven or eight new members all under the age of 30. Mr. Lally led discussion about the need to recruit college and community college young men. He also suggested that when a member moves, that a follow up take place in the new town. His recommendation that the Chapter in the new location, actively welcome and invite the person moving to the area.

<u>Division 2 VP Craig Hughes</u> reported that Division 2 is up over 56 members since June. Riverside and Inland Empire are talking about merging. Mr. Hughes also discussed the Leadership Academy.

<u>Division 3 Northwest VP Chuck Leavitt</u> reported several chapters in his Division are up, and some are also down since the last report. Mr. Leavitt also pointed out that the San Francisco Quartet Chapter needs to get legal.

<u>Division 4 Northeast VP Richard Lund</u> discussed Youth Harmony Camp. The Sunday before the Camp, the "King" fire started. There were 101 boys registered for the camp. They refunded all fees to the boys. Ponderosa School saved the event by allowing a one day event. Twenty six boys and 23 volunteers participated. Mr. Lund advised that Redding is thinking of starting a new chapter with the old charter. They have one member on the books, but more people are showing up. This prompted discussion from Russ Young, Dick Powell, and the board regarding the need to keep the Chapters Legal. It was pointed out by Mr. Young that if the Chapters are not legal, the Insurance will not cover those who are not members. This does not pertain to "Guests". Mr. Powell pointed out that the Society must police itself. Mr. Lund also reported that Elko is trying to form a chapter, and Placerville is enjoying a re-birth with their new Director.

<u>Division 5 Arizona VP John Bloomquist</u> discussed the Arizona Quartet Chapter not doing anything. Mr. Bloomquist also addressed that those Chapters who do not meet their Legal Requirements should be penalized, similar to a member that lets their dues lapse.

**President Allan Webb** called for a ten minute break at 3:50 PM.

<u>President Allan Webb</u> called the meeting back to order at 4:01 PM. Mr. Webb and Mr. Young recognized Ted Sayle with "Thank You" for putting his retirement on hold for two years to serve as Events Chairman. Ted introduced his replacement Mr. Bryan Forbes.

<u>Old Business:</u> Mr. Webb advised that six FWD Board members agreed to become "dual members" of the Whittier Chapter so the Charter could be saved. FWD Board Members agreeing to serve on the Whittier Board are: Allan Webb President; Bob Gray Secretary/Treasurer; Gordon Bergthold Vice President Chapter Development; Nick Papageorge Vice President Music & Performance; Russ Young Board of Directors Member-at-Large; Craig Hughes Board of Directors Member-At-Large.

<u>President Allan Webb</u> discussed the "goals" that were established three years ago. He pointed out that nothing had been done, and requested that the Board review them on the Forum. Mr. Webb also advised the Convention Manual will be updated. Jim Turnmire has agreed to combine the three manuals in one. He will work on this following the Fresno Convention.

Nick Papageorge and Craig Hughes discussed Harmony College West and the Leadership Academy on January 23<sup>rd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> 2015 in Las Vegas.

**<u>New Business:</u>** Discussion about keeping Chapters legal, and possible dissolution and the new directions that the Society will be heading.

<u>Awards Chairman Bill Cale</u> announced that John Jones is the honoree at the Fall Convention in Fresno. The awards committee recommended that Bill Kane be honored at the Spring Convention. Motion to approve the selection by John Bloomquist, Second by Bob Lally. **Motion Approved**.

<u>President Allan Webb</u> requested that the 2015 Budget be modified by \$4400. This is based on next year's Leadership Forum which will be a full Forum. Motion by Gordon Bergthold, Second by John Bloomquist that the 2015 Budget be modified to a "Net Zero" budget. **Motion Approved. The operating results for 2014 were effected by there being no HCW nor Leadership Academy during the calendar year of 2014. The Leadership Academy for incoming leadership at the beginning of 2014 was held in November of 2013 and it was subsequently decided to combine the Leadership Academy and Harmony College West in January 2015. The results were a deferral of revenue and expense to 2015.

Similarly, the Director Development seminar was not held in calendar year 2014.

District leadership continues to search for the most effective way to financially encourage musical and participation growth throughout the district chapters.

### **Brent Anderson, Division 1 Vice President (Southwest)**

I've had a great experience in my first couple months as Southwest Division VP. I've been in contact with all of my chapters although only superficially with some and I hope to make that a deeper relationship in the near future.

My chapters have reported a variety of concerns and nothing that should be a surprise to the Board. Some chapters are struggling to exist, such as Lompoc, and I'm engaged with one of the stalwarts there to see what, if anything can be done... Some, such as Santa Barbara and Santa Maria, have recently lost their musical director and are solving that problem in a variety of ways... Most chapters are muddling along, mostly having fun but lacking what it takes to grow both physically and musically. I sense the frustration of this year, looking like every other year, and they are anxious for something more, but understand that what they have is still pretty special.

Some, such as The Masters and Rincon Beach, and Pasadena are healthy and enjoying the benefits of good musical direction, active program events, still attracting members and enjoying the pleasure that comes from singing well under a talented and exciting musical team.

I think where I can make a difference (with help from the FWD leadership) is in making each meeting fun and satisfying so the men want to come back next week. I have some ideas that are just being fleshed out, working with Greg Lyne and Nick Papageorge to see if we can give chapters some help in learning some "Polecat Plus" songs...songs like Coney Island Baby, Nellie, Darkness on the Delta, Hello Mary Lou, and Sittin' On Top of the World... I know from experience that if a chorus or quartet could master those few simple, enjoyable, solid barbershop, songs, they could put on a public show and attract new members, not to mention having fun at a regular meeting night...

I floated the idea which Rincon "discovered" by accident...that singing barbershop is attractive to men with science, technology, engineering and math backgrounds. We had two engineering grad students from UCSB join the Rincon Beach chorus and they have attracted another six of their buddies who have joined or are currently in the process. Seeing that youth in the chorus has also attracted other young men who have seen and heard us in public performance. It has invigorated the chapter and really excited us old veterans like nothing in a long time. Although a well-known fact that people who are good in math are often good musicians, I think we've been prospecting for new members by looking for *singers* and perhaps we should be looking for *math majors!* Many of the chapter membership/development officers have liked this idea and we'll see if we can help them arrange to perform for some computer or engineering association meetings... Let's see what happens...

Most of my effort will be directed at the struggling chapters but hopefully the ideas and success we have can be translated to all the chapters in the FWD.

It is my pleasure to serve as the District CSLT of one of the Greatest Districts in our Society. I Love Barbershop Harmony and the fellowship associated with this Great Hobby.

I am a native of Las Vegas, and have been involved with the Society, and the Las Vegas Chapters, for 19 years.

I have previously directed both Choruses in Las Vegas, and also spent many years on the board as Music VP, supporting other directors. I was the President of the Las Vegas Chapter as we merged 2 choruses back together after 12 years of being apart. This experience has given me some real incite that I would like to share with you as time permits.

I want to first thank everyone who attended our Leadership Academy / Harmony College West. It was great having you in Vegas again. Thank you to all of the faculty who assisted with this event. I appreciate our District officers who support the efforts to continually improve our chapters.

Today I would like to present a few ideas about trust. The below excerpts come from an article "How the Best Leaders Build Trust" By: Stephen M.R. Covey. Is there a measurable cost to low trust? Is there a tangible benefit to high trust? How can the best leaders build trust in and within their organizations to reap the benefits of high trust?

When trust is low, in a company or in a relationship, it places a hidden "tax" on every transaction; every communication, every interaction, every strategy, every decision is taxed, bringing speed down and sending costs up. My experience is that significant distrust doubles the cost of doing business and triples the time it takes to get things done.

By contrast, individuals and organizations that have earned and operate with high trust experience the opposite of a tax -- a "dividend" that is like a performance multiplier, enabling them to succeed in their communications, interactions, and decisions, and to move with incredible speed. A recent Watson Wyatt study showed that high trust companies outperform low trust companies by nearly 300%! When you adopt these ways of behaving, it's like making deposits into a "trust account" of another party.

Remember these 13 Behaviors always need to be balanced by each other (e.g., Talk Straight needs to be balanced by Demonstrate Respect) and that any behavior pushed to the extreme can become a weakness.

The best leaders recognize that trust impacts us 24/7, 365 days a year. It undergirds and affects the quality of every relationship, every communication, every work project, every business venture, and every effort in which we are engaged. It changes the quality of every present moment and alters the trajectory and outcome of every future moment of our lives -- both personally and professionally. I am convinced that in every situation, nothing is as fast as the speed of trust.

# **Membership Chairman (Position Vacant)**

Membership Report submitted by Allan Webb

As of December 31, 2014, the Far Western District has an approximate total of 2768 members. Due to dual memberships, the real number is somewhere closer to 2600, but for the purpose of analysis we use per Chapter numbers which doesn't take into account dual memberships.

This 2768 number represents a year over year net loss of 177, or 6.4%. This is generally in line with overall membership loss across the Society.

Several Chapters experienced significant double digit percentage membership losses. In most cases, those kinds of losses are attributable to either a Director loss/change, or to a major personality conflict between a handful of members. When either the musical or social aspects of Chapter life become "not fun" anymore, membership attrition in a Chapter can be anywhere from 2-4x the usual rate. It behooves us to spend the time and resources necessary to do director development at the Chapter level (always have at least one assistant director who is capable of taking over), and try to resolve any nascent personality conflicts before they become membership affecting.

The District is still looking for a volunteer to take on the duties of the Membership Chair. Please contact EVP Gordon Bergthold if you have an interest in taking on this responsibility.


