2024 Arizona Division Convention Honoree

Carl "Doc" Dockendorf

An Arizona Division Convention Honoree who has done much for their chapter, the Division, the Far Western District and/or the Barbershop Harmony Society has been named at the convention over recent years, except for during the pandemic.

Should this year's selection be someone who belongs to two chapters and founded one of them or who was a BHS judge and coach for 20 years? How about someone who directed a chorus and was a member of the FWD Board as Arizona Division Vice President. Or it might it be someone who has 15 Person of Note awards as well as three

Chorus Gold Medals in International competition?

Surprisingly it was an easy selection because one person was found who has accomplished all of those deeds and more during his 63 years of BHS membership: Carl "Doc" Dockendorf.

Doc discovered Barbershop as a teenager in Ohio, browsing through a music store and finding a book of songs arranged for four-part harmony. He enlisted three classmates to form a quartet, known as the Coldfire Four. They adopted the name because they sang in the dark while wearing glowing fluorescent ties and shoelaces.

A tour in the Army and obtaining an engineering degree at the University of Illinois left him little time for singing, but several years later Doc found and joined his first chapter in West Palm Beach, Fla. In 1965 he moved to Arizona to a semiconductor engineering job with Motorola and joined the Phoenicians, who he sang with for 25 years, winning three Gold Medals and one Silver.

Doc kept busy judging dozens of BHS contests over 20 years and coaching quartets and choruses. He accumulated 15 Person of Note awards and served four years as Division Vice President. He was president of the Greater Phoenix (Phoenicians) and White Mountains chapters and has sung with many quartets including 20 years with the Pine Tones quartet.

Doc sang with the Scottsdale, Paradise Valley and High Country choruses and 10 years ago joined the East Valley Harmonizers, where he sings bass, the part he has performed throughout his singing career.

After retirement in 1998 he spent his summers in Show Low and winters in Mesa, until recently, and now participates full time with the East Valley Harmonizers. He also is a member, founder and former 18-year director of the High Country Chorus, which named him Barbershopper of the Year for 2001.

So, what has kept Doc singing, performing and attaining all of many accomplishments over the past 63 years? "I just love the sound, ringing chords and performing," he says is what has kept him going all of those years. Like many of us, the fellowship probably has played a big part, too.

Congratulations to Division Honoree "Doc" Dockendorf and wishing him many more years of four-part harmony.

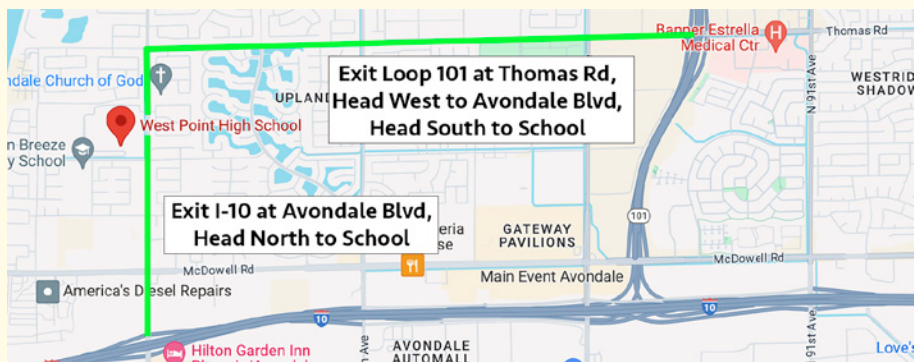

DETERMINING RELATIVE RANK

Music

Music is defined as the song and arrangement, as performed. The Music Category judges the arranger's skill and the performer's musicianship in bringing the mood or story of the song to life, and the suitability of the material to the barbershop style.

Performance

These judges evaluate how effectively a performer brings the song to life. They judge the entertainment value of the performance — the art of the performance.

Singing

In the Singing Category, artistic singing in the barbershop style is judged — listening holistically for ringing in-tune voices that use a free, beautiful and rich vocal quality, which is wonderfully unified and vocally expressive.

Each judge may award up to 100 points per song.

DEFINITION OF THE BARBERSHOP STYLE

Barbershop harmony is a style of unaccompanied vocal music characterized by consonant four-part chords for every melody note in a primarily homorhythmic (the same word sounds at the same time) texture. The melody is consistently sung by the lead (second tenor), with the tenor (first tenor) harmonizing above the melody, the bass singing the lowest harmonizing notes, and the baritone completing the chord. Occasional brief passages may be sung by fewer than four voice parts.

Barbershop music features songs with understandable lyrics and easily singable melodies, whose tones clearly define a tonal center and imply major and minor chords and barbershop (dominant and secondary dominant) seventh chords that often resolve around the circle of fifths, while also making use of other resolutions. Barbershop music also features a balanced and symmetrical form, and a standard meter. The basic song and its harmonization are embellished by the arranger to provide appropriate support of the song's theme and to close the song effectively.

Barbershop singers adjust pitches to achieve perfectly tuned chords (instead of tempered tuning like the piano) in just intonation while remaining true to the established tonal center. Artistic singing in the barbershop style exhibits a fullness or expansion of sound, precise intonation, a high degree of vocal skill, and a high level of unity and consistency within the ensemble. Ideally, these elements are natural, not manufactured, and free from apparent effort.

The performance of barbershop music uses appropriate musical and visual methods to convey the theme of the song and provide the audience with an emotionally satisfying and entertaining experience. Barbershop singers traditionally do not hold sheet music. The musical and visual delivery is from the heart, believable, and sensitive to the song and its arrangement throughout. The most stylistic performance artistically melds together the musical and visual aspects to create and sustain the illusions suggested by the music.

Barbershop can be performed in quartets as well as choirs, and can be found all over the world in male, female, and mixed ensembles.

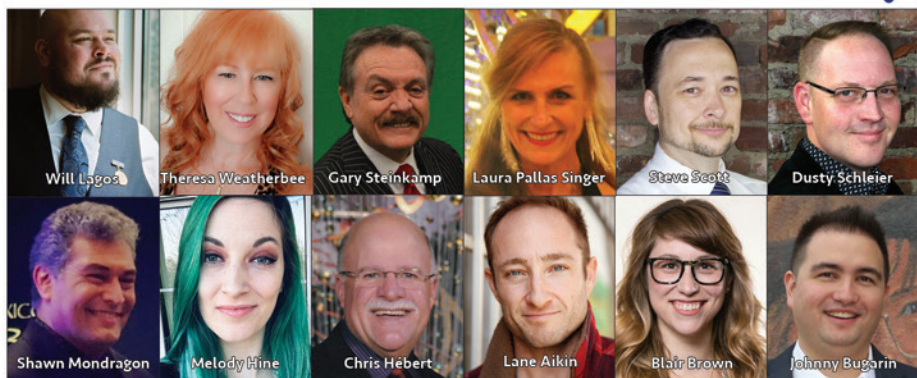

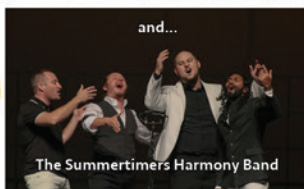
