In Memoriam

In 2024 we dedicated the Arizona Division Convention in his honor; today we rededicate the 2026 Arizona Division Convention in his memory.

Carl "Doc" Dockendorf, 92, passed away peacefully in his home surrounded by family after living a long, happy, and healthy life on March 31, 2026. He was born on November 10, 1933, in Ashland, Ohio, to Albert and Mabel Dockendorf.

He proudly served his country in the United States Army.

He later earned his degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Illinois and worked for Motorola as an electrical engineer for 33 years. Doc's life passion was barbershop music, which he was involved in for 65 years, first as a singer and later as a director. Through barbershop, he formed many lifelong friendships and found great joy in music.

Doc discovered Barbershop as a teenager in Ohio, browsing through a music store and finding a book of songs arranged for four-part harmony. He enlisted three classmates to form a quartet, known as the Coldfire Four. They adopted the name because they sang in the dark while wearing glowing fluorescent ties and shoelaces.

He met the love of his life, Jacqueline Sue Dockendorf, in Florida. They were married before moving to Arizona in 1965 and shared 61 wonderful years of marriage together. Doc and his wife split their time between the Valley and the White Mountains until 2025, when they moved to Camp Verde, Arizona, where they continued to enjoy Arizona's beautiful scenery and close-knit community.

Doc sang bass with the Phoenicians for 25 years, winning three Gold Medals and one Silver. Additionally, he sang with the Scottsdale, Paradise Valley and High Country choruses, and the East Valley Harmonizers. He judged dozens of BHS contests over 20 years and coached numerous quartets and choruses. He accumulated 15 Person of Note awards and served four years as Division Vice President. He was president of the Greater Phoenix and White Mountains chapters and sang with many quartets including 20 years with the Pine Tones Four.

He is survived by his loving wife, Jacqueline Sue Dockendorf; his daughters, Julie Lalime (Jeff) and Jill Rayburn (Brian); his grandchildren, Sloane Olbricht, Katie Lalime, Nicole Lalime, Kody Rayburn (Kelsie), Mason Rayburn (Zandi), and Jaydyn Rayburn (Jason); and his great-grandchildren, Carson, Layne, and Kyle Rayburn. He was preceded in death by his daughter, Joy Benoit.

Carl "Doc" Dockendorf will be remembered for his dedication to his family, his service to his country, his long and accomplished career, and the joy he brought to others through music. He will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.

He directed the Masters of Harmony to four gold medals and Sound of the Rockies to two medalist finishes, and he is a certified Musicality judge and a widely sought after coach for choruses and quartets alike. In 2025 he was inducted into the Barbershop Harmony Society. In addition, he is known for arranging classics like *You Make Me Feel So Young*, *My Ideal*, and *Always*.

The Phoenicians, with its 80+ year history in the greater Phoenix area and commitment "to be the most entertaining and musically excellent choral organization at the center of a vibrant community in Arizona," is thrilled to have Mark at the helm as they embark on this new chapter in their history.

Determining Relative Rank

Music

Music is defined as the song and arrangement, as performed. The Music Category judges the arranger's skill and the performer's musicianship in bringing the mood or story of the song to life, and the suitability of the material to the barbershop style.

Performance

These judges evaluate how effectively a performer brings the song to life. They judge the entertainment value of the performance — the art of the performance.

Singing

In the Singing Category, artistic singing in the barbershop style is judged — listening holistically for ringing in-tune voices that use a free, beautiful and rich vocal quality, which is wonderfully unified and vocally expressive.

Each judge may award up to 100 points per song.

Definition of the Barbershop Style

Barbershop harmony is a style of unaccompanied vocal music characterized by consonant four-part chords for every melody note in a primarily homorhythmic (the same word sounds at the same time) texture. The melody is consistently sung by the lead (second tenor), with the tenor (first tenor) harmonizing above the melody, the bass singing the lowest harmonizing notes, and the baritone completing the chord. Occasional brief passages may be sung by fewer than four voice parts.

Barbershop music features songs with understandable lyrics and easily singable melodies, whose tones clearly define a tonal center and imply major and minor chords and barbershop (dominant and secondary dominant) seventh chords that often resolve around the circle of fifths, while also making use of other resolutions. Barbershop music also features a balanced and symmetrical form, and a standard meter. The basic song and its harmonization are embellished by the arranger to

provide appropriate support of the song's theme and to close the song effectively. Barbershop singers adjust pitches to achieve perfectly tuned chords (instead of tempered tuning like the piano) in just intonation while remaining true to the established tonal center. Artistic singing in the barbershop style exhibits a fullness or expansion of sound, precise intonation, a high degree of vocal skill, and a high level of unity and consistency within the ensemble. Ideally, these elements are natural, not manufactured, and free from apparent effort.

The performance of barbershop music uses appropriate musical and visual methods to convey the theme of the song and provide the audience with an emotionally satisfying and entertaining experience. Barbershop singers traditionally do not hold sheet music. The musical and visual delivery is from the heart, believable, and sensitive to the song and its arrangement throughout. The most stylistic performance artistically melds together the musical and visual aspects to create and sustain the illusions suggested by the music.

Barbershop can be performed in quartets as well as choirs, and can be found all over the world in male, female, and mixed ensembles.
