Four (Maybe More?) To Nashville!

Achieving the "magic number" of 1824 or more points (76%) in Bakersfield at the Far Western District International Quartet Preliminary contest were:

Still to come are the results of the FWD quartets that have chosen to compete out of District:, **VocalEase**, **Metropolis** and **Audacity**.

In FWD's combination Prelims/SoCal West Divisional at Bakersfield, there were a total of 12 quartets that trod the boards with some opting for the Prelims, some for the Divisional, and some for both.

The top SoCal West quartet qualifying for the FWD Fall District competition was Masterpiece (84%), (Rob Menaker, Mark Hale, Alan Gordon and Brett Littlefield) from Santa Fe Springs and Bay Area chapters. Also qualifying for the Fall contests were: The Crush (76.8%) and Expedia (67.2%).

Rincon Beach's *Pacific Sound* chorus took the top honors in the SoCal West Divisional contest with convention host, **San Fernando Valley's** *Valleyaires* and **Pasadena's** *Crown City Chorus* qualifying for the FWD Fall Contest.

The High School Quartet Contest, which was judged by a triple panel of seasoned quarteters (**Raymond Davis**, **Alan Gordon**, **Mark Hale**, **Gabe Caretto**, **Rob Menaker**, **Brian Philbin**, **Brett Littlefield**, **Jordon Litz** and **Mike Stewart**), showcased seven good-sounding young quartets vying for the crown.

Element (Foothill High School, Pleasanton) took the gold with **Booth Street Quartet** (Reno High School, Reno, NV) the silver, and **The Bandits** (Ponderosa High School, Shingle Springs)**The Overtones** (Tesoro High School, Las Flores) **The League of Ordinary Gentlemen** (Summerville Union High School, Tuolumne), **3rd Try** (Carson High School, Carson City, NV) and **Tone-Deft** (Jurupa Valley High School, Mira Loma) close behind.

The 2007 President's Award by IPP Bill Cale went to **Ron Murray** of the Placerville Chapter. **Les Woodson** was inducted (posthumously) into the prestigious **FWD Hall Of Fame** by **Dave Briner** and the near-dozen current members of HOF who were in attendance.
