2012 International MidWinter in Tucson Your Chorus Festival Results

Fifteen Choruses participated in the Youth Harmony Festival at the Midwinter Convention in Tucson Arizona. Five Youth Choruses from the Far Western District did themselves and the district proud.

The show started off with a bang when the Chandler High Young Ladies Chorus from Mesa Arizona entertained the audience performing five songs some of which were barbershop arrangements.



They were followed by their male counterparts from the Chandler High Young Mens Chorus who were the first in the lineup of contestants in the Youth Harmony Festival.



They were followed by Fullerton Honors Chorus who had a whopping 45 members on stage.

Later in the contest the other two Far Western District Choruses Sacramento Sound and Pacific Standard dazzled their audience with their performances.



Sacramento Sound finished their set by casually strolling off both sides of the stage while singing Feelin' Groovy. The crowd went wild wondering if they were coming back to take their applause.



The next Far Western District Chorus was the Boomtown Chorus from Southern California who had a very entertaining package which won them first place in Plateau A (average age 19 or less).



Finally Pacific Standard did great job to the glee of their audience. They were under the direction of not just one, or two, but three talented directors.

District Executive Vice President



For those of you who may not be familiar with the reporting structure outlined in the FWD SOP, the FWD EVP position oversees the activities of the chairmen of the various standing DMT committees (Chapter Support and Leadership Training, Chorus Director Development, Contest and Judging, Events, Marketing and PR, Member Services, Music and Performance, Youth In Harmony, and Financial Development). As such, it is fundamentally an operations role, similar to that of a corporate COO, but the bulk of the real work falls on the shoulders of the committee chairmen, the members of their teams, and their counterparts at the chapter level (where applicable).

I'm excited about all the things we have percolating in these areas for the coming year, but we have an immediate need to fill two of the chairmen positions which are either currently vacant or about to be vacated: Financial Development, and Events. We have not had a Financial Development Chairman for quite some time, and we have recently been informed by our rockstar Events Chairman (John Jones) that he has some plans for retirement that he'd like to pursue as soon as we can find a replacement for him. The Events Chairman position is particularly critical from an operations standpoint, as we have event dates set in stone which have to be planned for and executed upon. Anyone with a background in event planning, contracting with hotels and performance venues, project management, etc, would be a good candidate for this position. Both of these positions would involve selecting others to serve on your committee and to help share the load.

Per the SOP, the Financial Development Committee Chairman will:

- 1. Maintain a program for identifying notable charitable activities by individual chapters toward schools, charities or other non-profit organizations and publicly acknowledging those chapters in a suitable fashion.
- 2. Prepare a comprehensive financial development plan for the district with annual updates for board approval and endorsement. The plan shall include recognition of sources including chapters, events and identify suggested recipients including Harmony Foundation, local not-for-profit community services and/or charities.
- 3. Lead the annual district goal-setting process to determine challenging yet appropriate goals
- 4. Ensure that the best available volunteers accept the functional chapter and/or divisional chairmen positions
- 5. Include potential volunteers in ways that help identify skills and fit for future needs
- 6. Participate in the district annual fund- raising program planning process
- 7. Implement the district goals of the District Financial Development plan through chapter and/or divisional representatives, and provide the necessary information to the district recognition program identifying chapter donations to Harmony Foundation, local community service, and any other eligible not for profit organization.
- 8. Provide district key-item information monthly directly to the District President and others as he suggests.
- 9. Participate monthly with the President of the Harmony Foundation to formally review the key-item report generated from data supplied by both parties at the end of each month. Make that report available as directed by the District President.
- 10. Report to the district president, and serve on the work planning and budgeting team.
- 11. Attend all district board and house of delegate meetings when specifically invited by the District President.

The Events Committee Chairman is responsible for:

- 1. The effective planning and budgeting, site selection and operation of all events held within the district, including conventions, music festivals, alternatives to competition, music and leadership training schools. Etc.
- 2. Interpreting all Society regulations as they apply to district conventions.
- 3. Assuring that district convention manuals are up-to-date and used.
- 4. Maintaining a comprehensive convention history file on past and potential convention sites.
- 5. Acts as liaison with the Society Events Committee
- 6. Serves as chair of the District Events Committee and is responsible for filling all key positions on the Committee
- Actively monitors the activity of his representatives in each division, who will regularly review and update possible venue sites.
- 8. Attending FWD BOD and HOD meetings when specifically invited by the District President.
- 9. Shall annually appoint a Division Event Planner (DEP) for each Division to approve venues and supervise/support conventions and contests that are held in the Division.

If you or someone you know would be a good candidate for either of these positions, please contact me.



Our appreciation goes out to the Harmony Foundation for supporting the youth choruses and to those in the society and others who support the Foundation.

On Saturday night the show opened with the International Championship Scottsdale, Arizona Sweet Adelines chorus who were the highlight of the weekend for me. One hundred plus singers who danced, sang and thoroughly entertained the audience for about 30 minutes. They were followed by the Musical Island Boys and Old School, the number 2 and 1 medalists in 2011.

I think the reason I feel so strongly about attending conventions is that this is a way to experience what our founder, OC Cash, had in mind when they first met in Tulsa, Oklahoma. We are blessed to have such an outlet for our stressful lives and I say, "Keep the whole world singing"


- 1. You must be an active member of the Society

I also have a formula for the smaller chapters (10-25) to perform monthly, make \$600 every time they do, and spread the good sounds of songs everybody loves. <u> Operation Harold Hill – BHS sponsored program</u>

I encourage each chapter to join up and be a part of OHH. There are 14 helpful hints within this program on how to expose your chapter to your community and bring in new singers. By signing up, you'll be assigned a special Harold Hill assistant that will be your special rep to talk to and work closely with throughout the year for even more "bang for the buck".

<u>Old Habits – New Concept</u>

Did you know 99.9% of the 7 billion people on this planet, can sing. That doesn't mean they sing well or even on pitch, but the vocal chords were installed by nature and they can make a noise. It only takes using them as a vocal instrument to sing, similar to using a musical instrument that might otherwise be stored in a closet. So 3 ¹/₂ billion of these people are males who we want to talk with. We will *give them hope* that they can sing without being soloists, and have fun doing it. <u>Here's what's different</u> ----Instead of telling everyone about your hobby and trying to interest them in it, here's a new way to approach everyone. *Established and refined over the past two years by Paul Ellinger, VP Membership, PIO.*

You ask the question -- "SO, WHERE DO YOU DO YOUR SINGING?" Every day there are opportunities for you to bring this question into a conversation, just look for them. Most will respond with "In the shower" or "with the radio". Your response is: "Me to, but that's why I sing with a bunch of guys on Tues night. None of us are professional but singing together produces a unit sound that we could never do alone. We learn new techniques every time we meet and sing all kinds of music from show tunes, 50's, 60's, oldies, pop, gospel, holiday, you name it. 60% don't even read music. You should come over and take a look." (the closer) "COULD I GET YOUR CARD? I'LL CALL YOU LATER AND WE CAN TALK MORE". Get their phone # and a name to call them later. Only then will you formally invite them to your meeting.

This is far different than you handing them a card or flyer. <u>Getting their</u> information, you control inviting them to your chapter meeting. <u>Give them</u> your information and they pre judge what you're talking about and you've lost that control before they ever get to sing a tag or hear you in action. You've all heard; – "Sell the sizzle – Not the steak." Singing with a group of guys, none professional, but making great a cappella music together is the Sizzle.

Good active singers will tell you they are, and we certainly welcome them also. They would be interested in having fun too, but with quartet work, competitions, show performances, solo's, musical directorships, administration work, etc. With the two kinds of singers out there – *sing for themselves* – *sing for others*, we can satisfy both! After all – we are the world's largest men's singing organization, headquarters in the Music City of Nashville.

Ok, practice makes perfect, and as Garry T. says, permanent. So let's all get crackin', every day, and have some FUN! If you're having fun – They will come!



HARMONY COLLEGE WEST JULY 20 – 22, 2012 REDLANDS, CA

The University of Redlands in Redlands CA. will be our home for this year's HARMONY COLLEGE WEST. Members of the FWD will be rocking with music during the weekend of July 20-22, 2012. BARBERSHOP MUSIC! The members of the faculty are today's legends that will be talked about tomorrow. The classes are more fun than you can imagine and the extra curricular activities, especially the late night tagging and old song singing, are worth the registration cost. Attendees will gain knowledge that will help them become better singers and enjoy their hobby more. But more importantly, their chapters will be rewarded because of the vast knowledge that will be brought back to the chapter. In order to entice about 100 more FWD barbershoppers to attend the school this year, I am changing the structure a little bit by creating a "track-type" schedule. Each track will have different courses within it, and students can choose between them. In most cases, the courses will be hierarchal. However, students can choose to take any course in any order if they so desire. This tracking system will offer a more understandable vision of what courses they may want to take now, and in the future.

Here are the prospective Tracks and the Courses:

Barbershop Potpourri: So You Want To Be A Judge? Tag Singing/Woodshedding. Society District Videos. Barbershop Smorgasbord (What are – Society, FWD, My Chapter....)

Directing: So You Want To Be A Director? Directing I, Directing II, Making It Happen (front-line directors)

Vocal Techniques: Vocal Techniques 101. Vocal Techniques I. Vocal Techniques II. How To Be A Great (Lead, Tenor, Bass, or Bari).

Chapter Leadership: Membership/Retention (includes Society and District Programs). YMIH Chairmen. Leadership Class.

Arranging: Barbershop Theory. Arranging I. Arranging II.

Quartet Coaching: 8 Hours of coaching from the District and Society's greatest quartet coaches.

Every one of us has an immense impact on the attendance at our District school. Without your continued support over these next 4 months, the attendance will remain the same: about 115 students. Our district desperately needs this attendance to double, and not just monetarily. HCWest is the greatest place to immerse our newer members in our hobby. Ask them to attend with you. Go to your chapter meeting and encourage your fellow members to join you this year as well! Greater attendance will allow us to offer the great classes that you want to take. The lower the attendance at the school, the lower the class offerings. So, help keep those offerings at a high level.

We will also be continuing "Small Chorus Coaching." This is a "class" that has a small chorus being coached for 4 hours, and then their members take classes for the remaining four hours. Last year the Eureka California Chapter attended as a chorus and was coached by Gary Bolles. They had the time of their lives! Get your small chorus enrolled now. **ATTEND HARMONY COL-LEGE WEST!** By the time you read this, the District Board will have put the final touches on the newest Music and Performance program: Chapter Coaching. This will allow Chapters that normally don't receive coaching to be coached by one of our outstanding District coaches. Stay tuned for the specifics! Also, remember to continue to use our Coaching Reimbursement Program, and Standing Ovation Review Program.

Lastly, I strongly urge your chapter to attend or participate in your divisional convention/contest. Not only does attendance at these conventions provide revenue to keep our district programs alive, but it also allows us to renew old singing friendships and foster new ones! See You There!



The 50th Annual Southern California Novice Quartet Contest was held January 28, 2012, at the Village Theater in Orange. The Orange Quartet Chapter hosted this year's event, carrying on the long-standing tradition of the Westminster Chapter to promote the formation and development of quartets.

2011 International Chorus Champions The Masters of Harmony

The Masters of Harmony kicked off a busy holiday season by returning to Riverside's beautifully renovated Fox Theater for a Christmas show. Many in the capacity audience were hearing the Masters for the first time and they joined returning fans in loud, sustained applause throughout the show. Despite being thoroughly drained by the performance, the Masters men reassembled on stage about a half hour after show time for two additional hours of show quality videotaping under the direction of videography expert and chorus member Gary Stone. The taping will be used to produce a promotional CD that demonstrates the show worthiness of barbershop style harmony to future concert planners.

For the second year in a row, the Masters staged their annual Christmas show in Pasadena's legendary Ambassador Auditorium. Because of its ability to faithfully reproduce all the musical shadings of which performers are capable, the Ambassador Auditorium has been called the Carnegie Hall of the West. Based on audience reactions, the combination of the Masters talent in a world-class setting, with fresh, innovative program staging and scripting, produced probably the chorus's most spectacular and entertaining Christmas show ever. New to this show were a ukulele band, a new rousing song by audience favorite Les Weiser and his always crowd-pleasing Boyz in the Band combo, and even costumed Nativity actors in the sacred set at the end of the concert. In a hushed finale with house lights dimmed,

the Masters filed off stage holding candles and encircled the audience while singing "Silent Night."

For most of its history, the Masters have been fortunate to have excellent, well-furnished, centrally located rehearsal facilities generously provided by its host and namesake city, Santa Fe Springs. As they have for many years, the chorus once again repaid this generosity in several ways. One was to perform a mini-concert, along with other city music groups at the city's annual tree-lighting ceremony. Another was by providing quartets to sing holiday songs on a float preceding the Santa Claus float that travels to designated city locations each night for two weeks in mid-December. Special kudos go to Larry Goodfried who for years has worked tirelessly to make sure that a quartet is available for each night of this event, and to volunteer Ken Arnold, who for most of its long history has superbly managed an event so eagerly anticipated by kids and their parents throughout the community. At some point in the quartet entertainment, willing kids are invited onto the float stage and sing along with the quartet while parents proudly snap pictures of kids who may one day grace the stage of American Idol . . . or become future barbershoppers!

Thanks to the efforts of AJ Manker, the Annual Awards Banquet and Installation of Officers found a new home at Khoury's Restaurant in Long Beach. Keynote speaker for the event was Bob Lally, fourtime gold medalist with the Masters of Harmony and past president of the Far Western District. Bruce Oldham received the 2011 Barbershopper of the Year Award. The zany, crowd-pleasing foursome known as Tenacious Q was named the top chapter quartet for 2011.






SAN DIEGODUCROT PEPYSThe Sun Harbor Chorus celebrated the holiday sea-

Although I am no longer your DVP, I am always available to assist or advise as my time allows. Please contact me any time. I will see you in Woodside.




