Far Western District Statement of Policy states "The Objective is to Honor the all-time Far Western District "Greats", individuals who have unselfishly, with dedication and devotion, performed through the years in the highest degree of service to the Far Western District "

After a few remarks, 2016 Hall of Fame Chairman Richard Lund, began the presentation:

The barbershopper that I have the distinct privilege of introducing to you as our newest honoree being inducted into the Far Western District Hall of Fame is a Long time barbershopper of more than 37 years.

He has been an assistant director and a front line director multiple times and for numerous chapters. He has sung in two Far Western District Champion quartets, and one of his quartets medaled four times back in the nineties placing as high as third internationally. He has coached many choruses and quartets over that 37 year career including a recent International Senior Quartet Champion.

He has been a certified judge in the Singing category for 18 years and was on the Category Board of Review for 3 years and served as the Category Specialist for another 3 years. He served as the Far Western District Associate Contest and Judging Chairman for 6 years. He then became the Executive Vice President of the Far Western District for 2 years, followed immediately as the Far Western District President for 2 years, serving a total of 12 years on the FWD Board of Directors.

He is responsible for the design and manufacture of the large metal medallion on the front of this very lectern that I am standing behind that honors our beloved Hall of Fame member, Doug Maddox.

He currently serves the Far Western District as the head of the District Production Coordinator Team that oversees all of the audio and visual enhancements for all of our District Conventions. He has MC'd many contest sessions for Far Western District Conventions and served in numerous other convention activities.

He was the FWD YMIH chairman for several years and served as a clinician for many one day Festivals and weekend Harmony Camps. He was on the founding board of the FWD Chorus Directors Guild, with Howard Mesecher, Lloyd Steinkamp, and Lou Laurel. He has served on the Harmony University faculty in the Directors College as well as the BHS committee that started the Youth Festival at Midwinter Conventions.

In summary he has, for the past 37 years, actively and unselfishly, with dedication and devotion served both the FWD and the BHS in all of the many areas that I have detailed before, and comes now to be our next inductee into the Far Western District Hall of Fame:



Far Western District Chorus Champions

Santa Fe Springs Chapter by Ron Larson

Philosopher William James once said, "The greatest use of a life is to spend it on something that will outlast it." Over the years, Masters of Harmony members have devoted considerable time and effort making that statement a reality for others interested in barbershop harmony. One such example came in the fall of 2011 when MOH member Joey Buss started the Boomtown Chorus. Comprised of young men mostly in their late teens and early 20s, the chorus competed in the 2012 International Youth Chorus Festival in Tucson, Arizona. The group won the championship for choruses with an average age under 19. Last January, Boomtown competed in the 2017 Youth Festival at the International Midwinter Convention in San Antonio, Texas. Under the direction of Brett Littlefield, Boomtown earned a Superior rating in the Plateau AAA category (20 to 25 age range).

Possibly the best-known example of the Masters' members tireless efforts on behalf of other aspiring singers is Mark Freedkin's signature staging of the 17th Annual Young Men's Harmony Festival at Orange Coast College in Costa Mesa. Co-sponsored by the Southern California Vocal Association, a professional organization of choral music teachers, this unique vocal music festival brings young men from all over the southland for a full day of barbershop harmony coaching. Its success has led to the development of similar events all over the country. Following preliminary warm-ups, The Newfangled Four (Joey Buss, Jackson Niebrugge, Ryan Wisniewski, Jake Tickner), a foursome not much older than the students themselves, held the young men in rapt attention with a rousing demonstration of the barbershop style. The Masters of Harmony and The Newfangled Four took turns captivating the highly appreciative audience for the evening show. For the show finale, 280 singers filled the risers to overflowing and sang "Fun In Just One Lifetime" and "America the Beautiful" to wildly enthusiastic applause from the nearly 250 parents, families, teachers and friends in attendance.

In 2002, Andy Edwards pioneered a Singing Valentines Program. This involves delivering a single red rose and a personalized Valentine's card to a usually surprised and delighted recipient, followed by the singing of "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" and "Heart Of My Heart." Over the next few years, the program met with varying degrees of success and was discontinued. In 2016, the Masters of Harmony revived the program by partnering with the Fullerton Orange Empire Chorus, known for its very successful Singing Valentines Program. The partnering was repeated in 2017 and three MOH quartets delivered a total of 20 singing Valentines. The overjoyed recipients

included office workers and teachers at a Catholic school and nursery school. One recipient was a former barbershopper at a retirement home who took over the lead for "My Wild Irish Rose" to the delight of his friends. Special thanks go to Sheila Lowerre, Tom Nichols, and Jay Campbell, who skillfully coordinated the complex delivery schedules.

Over the years, the sheer size of the Masters of Harmony has limited the chorus's ability to perform in certain places. To give the chorus the flexibility to accept invitations to perform in smaller venues, the MOH created a group of about 24 singers called Masters Ensemble. In March, Masterworks (Adam Marangakis, Tom Moore, Joe D'Amore and Cody Littlefield) from the ensemble sang for the Whittier Police Department's 19th Annual Silver Shield Award Banquet, a formal event held in Industry Hills, California. This event also celebrated Whittier PD's 100th year of serving and protecting the citizens and businesses in Whittier. The quartet's stirring rendition of The Star Spangled Banner drew a huge ovation from the 700 people attending the event.

Since the last issue of *Westunes*, the Masters of Harmony have welcomed Norm Finn, Will Harris, Billy Hill, Justin McQueen, Logan Patrick-Miernicki, Jim Schumacher, Travis Tabares and Wesly Tan into membership.

Robert Rund of the Harmony Foundation was also available to all members and leaders for issues pertaining to the Foundation's goals and focus.

Our FWD leadership team is very active in their respective communities and to illustrate one of those activities please go to <u>v6. Hayden's Story - NBA Cares 2017</u> on YouTube and experience what District Vice-President, Richard Lund, did with his quartet recently. While there are many illustrations of this type of dedication to our avocation by other leaders in our District, this one is extremely rewarding.

Being on the FWD, or your own chapter, leadership team is a very rewarding, yet sometimes strenuous position; but it allows you as a member of the Society to realize how much goes into keeping the districts and chapters operating at a sustainable level. We are losing chapters, and members, throughout the society due to aging, availability of other opportunities for extra-curricular activities, and a loss of directors. The loss of directors and the loss of members is a mixed dilemma that seems to be caused by many challenges; however, the apathy and exit of members and the extra work piled on the directors

and others who try to do everything for the struggling chapter/chorus seems to be one of the major factors.

This issue is being addressed by your District leadership and the Society through the training of Facilitators who are now available with only a phone call or email to your district vice-president. These men have spent time in Nashville with others from the society learning how to facilitate the various challenges facing our chapters. Simply ask for help and we'll see to it that your request is met in a satisfactory manner. Another tool is "The Healthy Chapter Initiative" that can be read at www.barbershop.org/healthychapters. This is yet another way the Society is attempting to align itself with the 17 districts and 700+ chapters in order to streamline communications.

Bottom line is this! Your District leadership and the Society headquarters are in constant communication trying to make the Barbershop experience one that makes you proud and wanting to bring our music to others throughout the communities in the FWD and the world.

Your chapter brothers have a better experience because YOU come to rehearsal. And when you give, you get so much in return.

Which brings me to another favorite subject: Why don't you form a quartet? Nothing will make you a better singer faster, than forming a quartet. The responsibility you must take in a quartet of holding your own, tuning the chords, knowing all the notes and words...those responsibilities make you a better chorus member and a better brother to all your chapter brethren. And quartetting is so much fun!


All you need is four guys who enjoy each other and enjoy ringing chords. You don't have to be world-class by any stretch. There are so many audiences who will appreciate and love the four of you singing harmony together and they will have no idea, nor will they care, if you have ever won quartet medals.

What songs will you sing? I'll let you in on a secret...the secret to the 30+ year success of my quartet, **Quartet du Jour** ('Like" us on Facebook). What's that name mean? You think the definition is some fancy French derivation...? No, **Quartet du Jour** is defined as "any three guys who will sing with Brent Anderson." And the songs Q du J sings are Coney Island Baby, Wait 'Til the Sun Shines Nellie, Hello Mary Lou, Chordbusters March with First Hello thrown in for the requisite ballad, and finishing with Darkness on the Delta. All these songs are in the new Polecat II book and professional, part-specific learning tracks are available

and inexpensive. You may think these songs are too easy or too common for quartet repertoire, but you're wrong. They demonstrate the beauty and strength of Barbershop Harmony, and the audiences think this is the greatest thing they've ever heard. We open with *Coney* and finish with that wonderful tag in *Darkness*, and the smiles and thanks are so fulfilling.

So find three other good guys (or find five or six and interchange as available) and learn these six songs and go thrill some audiences.

I will look forward to seeing you in Las Vegas. And, BTW, if you know any of those above-mentioned songs, let's find another couple guys and you can be in **Quartet du Jour**.

(Yes you read it correctly – 9 of our choruses qualified for the District Contest!)


I was equally proud that 11 of the 18 competing quartets were from the Southeast Division. And again, I was very proud of the great singing and performing of our quartets.

The BHS Midwinter Convention is coming to the FWD. It will be held in 2018 at the beautiful Segerstrom Hall in Costa Mesa, California from Tuesday Jan. 16 thru Sunday Jan. 21. Full sets from our current medalist quartets and invited superstars will headline two evening shows. The youth festival gets bigger every year (thanks to your support of Harmony Foundation), and has participants from around the world. While the youth event has become the biggest draw, the International Senior Quartet Contest will feature the best of our seasoned performers.

Last year a Senior Chorus Festival was added to the Convention. Districts may create a chorus with current (dues-paid) members with a minimum age of 55. With the Festival (don't call it a contest), on our home turf, should the mighty Far Western District have an entry?

To sing on the international stage, the District must have an official panel score their Senior Chorus. The top 5 scorers are invited to the Midwinter. With our large geographic area, we would have to use our Fall Convention as our scoring opportunity.

My first question was: Is this inclusive or exclusive? Should participation be open to all, or should there be criteria? What criteria? Some of us are a bit competitive (it's a man thing). Do we use the Platoon Model and restrict the chorus to those recommended by their chorus directors?

Clearly the men would have legal music and learning tracks and be expected to have the music memorized. Should they be prepared at a level that they could sing the songs in a quartet, or would rehearsal time be needed to learn notes and words?

Please let me know if you have an interest. The Board has asked that I collect input so we can decide if we should move forward. What criteria do you think appropriate? If interested, would you be willing to attend a regional rehearsal prior to October? Would you attend a Harmony College West weekend (probably SoCal in August) with "Senior Festival Chorus" as one of your course options.

Chairman Marketing & Public Relations

f you are the VP of Marketing & Public Relations for your chapter, then this article is for you. If you are NOT the VP of Marketing & Public Relations, then this article is for you also, because everyone should understand the key role that position plays in the success of your chapter.

Anyone who has held this position will agree that it can be summarized in two words: Constantly bombarded.

The VP of Marketing & Public Relations is basically the head of the sales department for your chapter. The key word here is "department". It is a BIG job, and in order to do it effectively you will need help. Build a committee from among your members, and even non-members if they are willing to help.

We call it marketing because in a broad sense you are creating and developing a market for a product. There are basically two things you and your team need to identify in order to be effective:

☐ What is your product?

☐ Who is your market?

Before you do anything else, get together with your team to come up with the answer to those two questions, and then

come up with a plan that you and your team can work to "divide and conquer" to meet the objective. Keep in mind that the scope of this should be more than just your annual show; it should encompass everything that your chapter has to offer throughout the year.

A good start is for you and your team to go through the 5-Minute marketing Plan.


- 1. **First Minute: Product** What can you do right now to improve the quality of your product or services in the eyes of your customers?
- 2. **Second Minute: Price** What offers can you provide to encourage new customers to try your product or current customers to be more loyal?
- 3. Third Minute: Placement What new approaches can you try to reach different customers?
- 4. **Fourth Minute: Promotion** What new ways of communicating with customers can you try right away?
- 5. **Fifth Minute: People** What can you do to make your customers feel more enthusiastic and thankful about your group and its product?

There is a lot of useful information and some great ideas and resources available on the Society and Far Western District websites to help you get started.

On the BHS website (barbershop.org) click on Resources, then Document Center and scroll down to Marketing. You'll find a selection of marketing materials, including templates for promotional flyers and brochures as well as a collection of public service announcement audio files that you can provide to your local radio stations to publicize an upcoming show, a patriotic holiday performance and other events.

The Far Western District website (farwesterndistrict.org) has a collection of documents and links to help you by clicking on Education. You'll find some great resources there; in particular I encourage you to look at the Leadership Academy presentations for both Marketing and Webmaster.

Ultimately, there is perhaps no better source for ideas than to see what others are doing. Nearly all of our chapter in the FWD have a website, or at the very least a Facebook page. You can find their websites from the FWD website by clicking on Chapters, and then Chapter Directory. Similarly you can also find chapters in other districts by first going to their district website by clicking on Links and then BHS – Districts. If you see something you really like, contact their marketing guy; chances are good he will be more than happy to talk to you and provide you with more information and ideas.

"What I've Learned"

In October, 2015; FWD President Mongo Bergholdt asked me to serve as District Historian. Mongo mentioned that our District would be 70 years old on October 22, 2016 and wanted someone to record our history.

Although my task has just begun (I have interviewed three past Hall of Famers to date), I learned they all consider the FWD the best. Their enthusiasm for their craft is inspiring. I feel fortunate they are willing to share their time and knowledge with me. Although I have been active in Barbershop for a dozen years, ten as a chapter officer, I had no idea how the District functioned.

The fruits of my labor will be a compilation of the Hall of Fame interview transcripts. What will the status of FWD Barbershopping be in five years when our District celebrates its 75th anniversary? I have learned from these men that anything is possible.
